








#### Counties Classified by Population Change in the Non-Hispanic White Population, 2000-2010




#### Counties Classified by Population Change in the Hispanic Population, 2000-2010






## Percent of Texas Population by Age Group and Ethnicity, 2000






## Percent of Texas Population by Age Group and Ethnicity, 2010




Texas Age Distribution April 1, 2010 Hispanic Population and White, Not Hispanic Population


## Percent of Texas Population by Age Group and Ethnicity, 2040\*




# Percent of United States Population by Age Group and Ethnicity, 2000






## Percent of United States Population by Age Group and Ethnicity, 2010




#### United States Age Distribution April 1, 2010 Hispanic Population and White, Not Hispanic Population





#### Projected Percent Change in Incidences of Disease/Disorder by Race/Ethnicity in Texas, 2000-2040\*








#### Percent Change in Prevalence of Conditions Associated with Disability by Race/Ethnicity in Texas, 2000-2040\*


## Projected Percent of Persons with Disabilities who are from each Racial/Ethnic Group, 2000 and 2040\*




## Percent Change in Selected Health Care Factors in Texas, 2000 to 2040\*






#### Projected Percent of Households in Poverty by Family Type in Texas, 2000 and 2040




## Projected Percent of Labor Force by Educational Attainment in Texas, 2000 and 2040





#### Average Annual Household Income in Texas and the United States by Educational Attainment of Householder in 2000\*






