

More about the Data

- The projections were developed using 2000 Census data
- Projections presented here are based on the 1.0 scenario
 - This assumes rates of net migration equal to those experienced by Central Texas from 1990-2000
 - Analysis of 2010 American Community Data shows that the 1.0 scenario most closely matches the growth patterns we have experienced from 2000-2010
- The Texas State Data Center will be releasing an updated set of projections based on American Community Survey data in the near future.




The Capital Area Region will add nearly 3 million people – That's equal to the total population of the state of lowa!



Growth by Race/Ethnicity




Population by Race/Ethnicity





Median Age


The Capital Area Region is growing older.





More About Aging

- Younger populations are becoming increasingly non-Anglo.
- ▶ The aging population is becoming increasingly diverse.





Growth in Households

There will be a boom in the number of households as the young Hispanic population begins to start families of their own.

- Growth in the number of households will exceed the rate of sheer population growth!
- By 2040, Hispanics will account for more than half of the households in the Capital Area Region.



More on Households


- More than half of all households will be married-couple households (with or without children).
- Growth in family households is projected due to higher marriage rates among Hispanic and Other populations.
- Family households living in poverty will increase by 108%!



Poverty and Income

- Poverty rates will remain disproportionately high for African Americans and Hispanics.
- In general, household incomes are projected to decline over time.







Poverty and Income

As a result of increasing poverty and decreasing household incomes, per capita tax revenues are projected to decline.






Housing Stock

- The rapid increase in the number of households will result in an increased demand for housing.
- Demand for non-rental housing stock will increase at a higher rate than rental housing stock because:
 - The population is aging
 - Older households tend to have more assets to purchase housing




Owner Households by Race/Ethnicity

Other Projections

- The aging population will greatly increase the number of nursing home residents.
- The projected yearly cost of caring for nursing home residents in the Capital Area region in 2040 is:

\$1.2 billion

- ▶ SNAP enrollment is projected to increase by 244%.
- The prison population is expected to grow at a similar rate.
